

"Imagery Cards" was designed and developed to support the work of youth workers, children's workers, social workers, counsellors, teachers, therapists, facilitators and parents to initiate conversation while creating opportunities for personal reflection, self-awareness and understanding.

Imagery Cards help people define their thoughts and feelings, get in touch with distant memories and experiences and translate them into words- something that's not always easy without the use of imagery.

What started as a university project in 2020, is now a



fully-developed tool dedicated to creating safe spaces for genuine conversation and reflection. More than Words is designed and illustrated by Sabrina David, and codeveloped by the most wonderful team of people dedicated to bettering the mental wellbeing of our people.
